Tu B'Shevat is referred to as the day that marks the beginning of a "New Year for Trees." This is the season in which the earliest-blooming trees in the Land of Israel emerge from their winter sleep and begin a new fruit-bearing cycle.

We observe Tu B'Shevat by eating fruits described in the Bible as being abundant in the land of Israel. Trees are regarded as special gifts from God and are symbols of goodness and nobility.
