Rona Mandel will present "Gematria Letters & the Power of Your Name"

Gematria is an Assyro-Babylonian system of numerology later adopted by Jews that assigns numerical value to a word or phrase in the belief that words or phrases with identical numerical values bear some relation to each other or bear some relation to the number itself as it may apply to a person's



age, the calendar year, or the like.

The best-known example of Gematria is the Hebrew word Chai ("alive"), which is composed of two letters that add up to 18. This has made 18 a "lucky number" among Jews, and gifts in multiples of 18 are very popular. Although ostensibly derived from Greek, Gematria is largely used in Jewish texts, notably in those associated with the Kabbalah.

Rona studied with Grand Master Yap Cheng Hai in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, and has a BA from UCLA.
