The Tenth of Tevet *Asarah B'Tevet*

Date of the fast in 5775: January 1, 2015

Coming as it does a week after the last day of Hanukkah, the fast on the 10th of the month of Tevet (Asarah B'Tevet) might easily be overlooked. It occupies, however, an important niche in the story of Israel and the history of our people.

The text in II Kings (25:1-4) tells us that on the 10th day of the 10th month, in the ninth year of his reign, (588 BCE), Nebuchadnezzar, the Babylonian king, began the siege of Jerusalem. Three years later, on the 17th of Tammuz, he broke through the city walls. The siege ended with the destruction of the Temple three weeks later, on the 9th of Av, the end of the first Kingdom and the exile of the Jewish people to Babylon. It can thus be considered part of the cycle of fasts connected with these events: Tzom Gedaliah (3rd of Tishrei); Shivah Asar B'Tammuz (17th of Tammuz) and Tisha B'Av (9th of Av).

The first mention of this fast appears in Zechariah (8:19) where it is called the "fast of the tenth month..." (counting from the month of Nisan, which was the first month in Biblical times). Other references to the fast and the affliction can be found in Ezekiel 24:1-2 (the siege); Jeremiah 52:4-6.

However, although the fast is historically tied in with events surrounding the destruction of the First Temple, the purpose of the fast is not the commemoration of an historical event, but the state of affliction of the Jewish people.

- As with all Jewish fasts, the prayers for Asarah B'Tevet include Selihot, marking the day as an occasion for each of us to devote time to Teshuvah (repentance), the introspection that motivates us to reexamine our actions and change our ways. As the Talmud in Brachot says, "one who is afflicted should examine his or her actions and do Teshuvah."
- Asarah B'Tevet is the day of mourning for people whose last resting place or date of death is unknown (the Kaddish Clali).
- Asarah B'Tevet is one of four public fasts which begin at dawn (alot hashachar about an hour before sunrise), but do not carry additional restrictions, such as washing oneself or wearing leather shoes, etc. (while Yom Kippur and Tisha B'Av begin from dusk the night before). However, it is the only fast which is not brought forward or postponed if it falls on a Friday, a mark of its immense significance.

BAT KOHEN/BAT LEVI

In keeping with a position adopted within our movement which affirms that a woman whose father is a KOHEN or LEVITE may consider herself a BAT KOHEN or BAT LEVI for the purpose of receiving the KOHEN or LEVI ALIYAH when she comes to the Torah, we will, on those occasions when we call people to the Torah as KOHEN or LEVI, embrace those who are BAT KOHEN or BAT LEVI as being eligible to take such honors. We know that not all women will choose to do this, but for those who do, once they have claimed this status, from that point on they will be eligible only for the KOHEN or LEVI ALIYAH.

If you are a BAT KOHEN or BAT LEVI, please let Rabbi Eisen know (*rabbi@caiaz.org*) so that we can be sure to look for you when assigning the honors.

Synagogue Life Council

Our Synagogue Life Council meets monthly. All committee chairs and some staff members give reports on their activities and events. Each month we feature one or two of our committees. In

September we had presentations from Bob Cohen of the Library Committee and Hedy Feuer of the Social Action Committee.

Bob Cohen reported that since February 2013, the Library Committee has made an effort to clean up and catalog the collection. In addition to discussing the library at CAI, he also explained that there is a Jewish Library Association serving and connecting several Southern Arizona Jewish libraries.

With the approval of the Board of Trustees, the Library Committee needs to address several issues regarding the library. Some important questions have to be answered: What is the role of technology in a modern library? Is the space we currently have for the library the best use of that space for the synagogue? How can we help the congregation understand the benefit the library affords them? How do we supervise, update and keep current our library resources? This work will be ongoing during this year.

Hedy Feuer, chair of the Social Action Committee, explained several programs in which CAI is involved to assist the community as a whole. The first program involves "snack packs" for children at Los Amigos Elementary School. These packages provide healthy snacks for children in need to take home for the weekend. CAI picks up the bulk food at the Community Food Bank, packages it for individual students, and delivers it to the school. The school then gives it to the students. CAI is also involved in providing dinner for the Catalina Men's Housing Center for men transitioning out of homelessness, as well as sorting food for the Community Food Bank several times a year. Please see the article to the right for more information about these programs and how you can help.

The "SLC" is happy to welcome Steve Singer as our new Chair of the Ritual Committee. I want to thank all of our volunteers for their hard work. The next meetings of the Synagogue Life Council will be at 7:00pm on November 10 and December 8 in the Cantor Falkow Lounge. All interested congregants are welcome to attend and participate.

Our New Year is off to a busy start. Our first month on the "Snack Pack" program is underway. The logistics of the program prove to be a challenge. We are still in need of drivers to pick up the food packets once assembled at CAI for delivery to Los Amigos Elementary School on: November 6, 13, 20, 25 and December 4,11 & 17. Much thanks to our delivery people Jerry Barkan, Lois Bodin, Kathy Hays, Rick Langert, Herb Meshel, Jack Strauss and Jerry Wolf.

Our first meal service at the Primavera Foundation Catalina Men's Housing Center (115 S. 4th Ave.) is complete. The following dates are still available to provide help: December 15, March 16 and May11, 2015. The Catalina Men's Housing Center is a permanent housing complex for men transitioning out of homelessness. There is a group of no more than 23 clients at the facility. Meal teams arrive at 3:30pm, set up and warm prepared foods and serve at 4:30pm. The project should be done by 5:00pm and we return to CAI just in time for Minyan! The project requires no more than 4 to 5 people to shop, cook, deliver and serve. This a great project for a few friends, havarot, Bar or Bat Mitzvah project, or Monday night Mah Jongg "widowers." Many thanks to our meal staff Della Kwasman, Linda Silverman and Jerry Wolf.

Look for information soon for the opportunity to help sort food at the Community Food Bank in December.







Giving Thanks: Innovation and the Alliance

This month, Americans everywhere take time to reflect and give thanks. While counting blessings often comes easily around the Thanksgiving table with family and friends, it becomes more challenging to find positive news when discussing the state of world affairs. The enduring strength of the U.S.-Israel relationship is a foundation upon which our nations can feel secure within an increasingly unstable Middle East. While the alliance allows our nations to confront old and new challenges, it also provides support to the innovative spirit America and Israel have always shared. The Jewish state continues to better the world with each technological breakthrough, providing solutions for individuals and societies as a whole.

The success of partnerships between America and the Startup Nation is widely recognizable through the impressive number of Israeli firms that have issued initial public offerings (IPOs) in the U.S. over the past year. Between 2012 and 2013, nine Israeli companies went public, raising \$400 million over two years. In 2014 alone, eight companies made initial stock offerings, raising \$1.2 billion – an indication that Israeli companies are gaining significantly more traction.

At the 2013 AIPAC Policy Conference, attendees witnessed a paralyzed man walk across the stage with the help of ReWalk Robotics' exoskeleton walking device. In the first three days of its 2014 IPO, shares of ReWalk Robotics rose more than 230 percent from its initial listing price. While the success of ReWalk's stock is attracting investors, its life-changing technology is improving the lives of countless individuals.

ReWalk is but one example of Israeli technologies going public this year. Jerusalem-based MobileEye, who engineers advanced driver assistance systems—which alert drivers to potential collisions—raised \$890 million in its initial public offering. MobileEye's IPO was the 10th-largest in the U.S. this year, and is the most successful by an Israeli company on the Nasdaq since 1999. The record offering represents a new wave of Israeli startups that are turning down acquisition offers to grow independently. The company plans to release products that will enable hands-free driving by 2016, helping to ensure safety on roads across the country.

ReWalk Robotics and MobileEye each presented to President Obama during his March 2013 trip to Israel and their acclaim has only grown since. Despite both companies releasing their IPOs in the midst of rocket attacks from Gaza, the hostilities did not deter their success on Wall Street.

This Thanksgiving, as we sit down with our friends and family, the partnership and contributions of the only democracy in the Middle East is something for which American citizens and the pro-Israel community can give thanks.
