

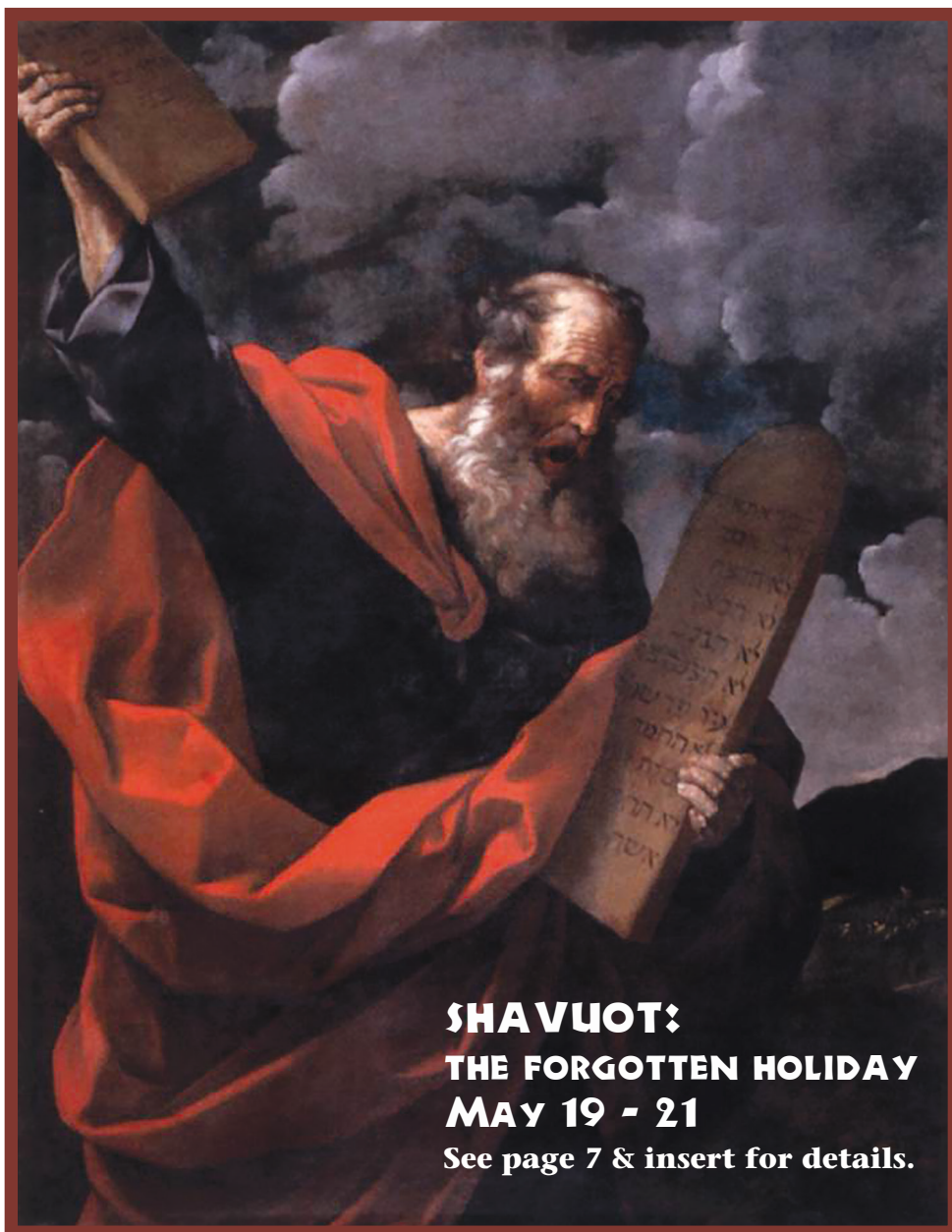

One of the most important values we can share is the importance of Shabbat worship, together as families. Should your little one(s) get restless, we offer a spot in Rabbi Breger Hall for them so parents can listen, see and participate in the service, as their children play with Shabbat-friendly toys and books.

## Bat Kohen/Bat Levi

A position adopted within our movement affirms that a woman whose father is a Kohen or Levite may consider herself a Bat Kohen or Bat Levi for the purpose of receiving the Kohen or Levi Aliyah when she comes to the Torah. We will embrace them as being eligible to take such honors on those occasions when we call people to the Torah as Kohen or Levi. We know that not all women will choose to do this, but for those who do, once they have claimed this status, from that point on they will be eligible only for the Kohen or Levi Aliyah. If you are a Bat Kohen or Bat Levi, please let Rabbi Robert Eisen know so that we can be sure to look for you when assigning the honors.

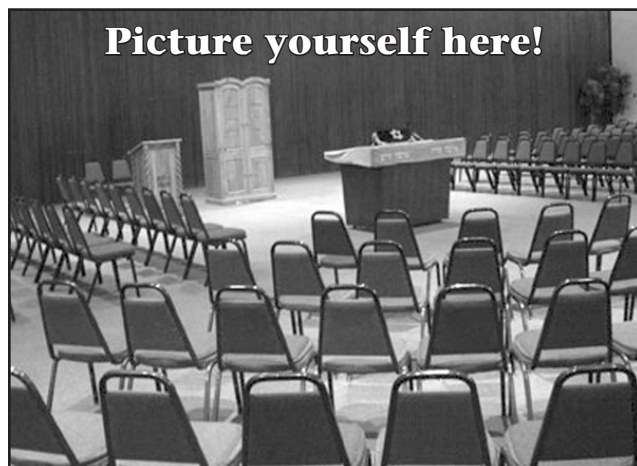

## **SHIV'A ASAR B'TAMMUZ**

The 17<sup>th</sup> of *Tammuz* is observed as a fast commemorating the breaking down of the wall of Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar and the cessation of Temple worship during the siege of Titus. It ushers in the three weeks of mourning which end with *Tisha B'Av*, the fast of the ninth day of *Av*. The three weeks between *Shiv'a Asar B'Tammuz* and *Tisha B'Av* are referred to as "between the straits," a phrase borrowed from Lamentations 1:3. The *Mishnah* mentions five misfortunes that befell the Jewish people on the 17<sup>th</sup> of *Tammuz* and five on the ninth of *Av* (*Ta'Anit* 4:6). The three weeks are concluded with the so-called Nine Days, from the first to the ninth of *Av*, during which the mourning is intensified until *Tisha B'Av* itself — the saddest day of the Jewish year.

**This year, because of Shabbat, the 17<sup>th</sup> of Tammuz is observed on July 1.**

## From the President

By the time you receive this edition of *Kolenu*, Yom Ha'Atzmaut will have already passed. Hopefully, you were able to attend our Shabbat celebration and the community-wide Israel 70 Festival! On the secular calendar, the Israel Declaration of Independence was signed on May 14, 1948. The United States of America was the first nation in the world to recognize the Jewish state, creating a bond that exists today. We each have a role in

Israel's ongoing story. According to AIPAC, our role is to, "strengthen, protect and promote the U.S.-Israel relationship in ways that enhance the security of the United States and Israel." According to J Street, we must, "Organize and mobilize pro-Israel, pro-peace Americans who want Israel to be secure, democratic and the national home of the Jewish people."

You may have noticed that there is great debate over how we ought to strengthen, protect and promote, and what it means to be secure and democratic. Debate is something that characterizes Jews and our interactions with one another. Debate, disagreement, argument for the sake of argument. That said, I think we can all agree on our unconditional support for the existence of the State of Israel. Whether you are a "J-Streeter" or an "AIPACer," we are all moved when we hear Israel's National Anthem, our National Anthem, *Hatikva*:

As long as within our hearts,  
The Jewish soul sings,  
As long as forward to the East  
To Zion, looks the eye –  
Our hope is not yet lost,  
It is two thousand years old,  
To be a free people in our land  
The land of Zion and Jerusalem.

You may not be aware but, according to *My Jewish Learning.com*, "Almost from the moment of its creation, *Hatikva* has served as both a beloved anthem throughout the Jewish world and a subject of political debate. Nevertheless, *Hatikva* remains an enduring symbol of Jewish nationhood and Israeli identity. And in November 2004, over a century after its composition, *Hatikva* was officially designated the Israeli national anthem by the Israeli Knesset, bringing its journey full circle."

This year, our Annual Meeting falls on Monday, May 14, the secular anniversary of the establishment of the State of Israel. Please join us, not to argue but to celebrate both the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Israel becoming an independent nation, and Congregation Anshei Israel's continued journey to serve as a source of spiritual, educational and social enrichment in order to encourage and ensure Judaic values in accordance with the Principles of Conservative Judaism ... in other words, to **LIVE Y/OUR JUDAISM TOGETHER!**

## Middle East Spotlight

### Israel's 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

On May 14, we will celebrate Israeli's 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary. This is a momentous occasion, not only for Israelis but for people around the world—virtually all of whom have benefitted in some way from Israel's existence.

Since its establishment in 1948, the Jewish state has provided an outsized contribution to humanity. From water, renewable energy and medicine, to intelligence, cyber defense and homeland security, Israeli advancements and innovations improve and preserve countless lives in Israel, America and around the world.

Israelis have brought cutting-edge water technology to drought-stricken Africa and California, administered natural disaster relief to Nepal and Houston, and supplied life-saving technologies used by U.S. service members serving overseas.

In just 70 years, the Jewish state has managed to produce 12 Nobel Laureates, among the highest number per capita in the world. Regularly ranked among the most innovative countries in the world, Israel has attracted major research centers of international companies including Apple, Google, Microsoft, Amazon and Facebook.

Despite perennial threats emanating from regional conflicts and hostile neighbors, Israel is ranked the 11<sup>th</sup> happiest country in the world, as well as sixth in the world in terms of its "health-adjusted life expectancy," according to the U.N.'s annual World Happiness Report.

For the past 70 years, the U.S.-Israel alliance has helped ensure Israel's security in a hostile region. This important bilateral relationship has also provided the United States with unparalleled intelligence and technological advancements that help keep Americans safe.

The U.S.-Israel relationship is about more than just security. In March, Congress appropriated money to establish a U.S.-Israel Center of Excellence in renewable energy and water innovation. This center will expand cooperation in these cutting-edge technologies that better our planet and people's lives.

In recent years, cooperation between Israel and some of its moderate Arab neighbors has reached previously unimaginable levels. While much of this cooperation remains unpublicized, to be sure, these new relationships represent an incredible achievement — catalyzed by a combination of Israeli ingenuity and innovation and a strong and unwavering U.S.-Israel partnership.

Given its tumultuous existence — a small nation surrounded by enemies — Israel's survival alone after 70 years would be worth celebrating. It is truly a blessing what this remarkable nation has been able to accomplish in such a short period of time, and against all odds.

In 1949, Winston Churchill declared, "The coming into being of a Jewish state in Palestine is an event in world history to be viewed in the perspective not of a generation or a century, but in the perspective of a thousand, two thousand or even three thousand years." Given Israel's miraculous first 70 years, we can only imagine what Israel will be able to accomplish by then.

## SHAVUOT: THE FORGOTTEN HOLIDAY

The Shavuot Festival, otherwise known as Pentecost (50<sup>th</sup> day) or Feast of Weeks, was celebrated primarily as a thanksgiving for the wheat harvest; it falls seven weeks after the barley harvest, when an Omer of the new produce was offered. The Torah refers to Shavuot as Hag Ha-Katsir (The Feast of the Harvest) and Yom Ha-Bikkurim (The Day of First Fruits), observed by offerings of the best ripe produce of the fields (Exodus 23:16; Numbers 28:26).

In the course of time, and as a result of the transformation of the agricultural festivals into historical commemorations, the additional significance of Shavuot as the festival of the Giving of the Torah (Z'man Matan Torateynu) at Mount Sinai completely overshadowed its original significance. Though the Bible does not identify Shavuot with the anniversary of the giving of the Ten Commandments, the tradition, undisputed in the Talmud, has been that the Torah was given on the sixth day of Sivan.

Shavuot is called Atzeret in the Mishnah and the Talmud, in the sense that it serves as a concluding festival to *Pesah*. In the observances of Shavuot, the historical as well as the agricultural aspects are reflected. The Decalogue is read in the synagogue on the first day. The first night of the festival is often spent in reading an anthology of sacred writings called *Tikkun Leil Shavuot*. The Book of Ruth is read for its description of a summer harvest in Israel. Milk dishes are the customary foods, symbolizing the Torah which is likened to milk, according to the allegorical interpretation of the Song of Songs, "honey and milk are under your tongue."

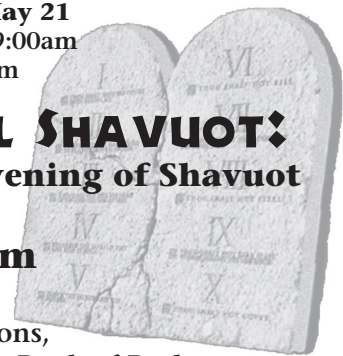
