4:00PM JUNE 23 • HAVA NAGILA - THE MOVIE (NR • 1 HR 15 MINS.)



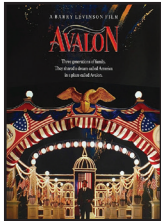
It's to music what the bagel is to food: a Jewish staple that has transcended its origins and become a worldwide hit. Follow the infectious party song on its fascinating journey from the *shtetls* of Eastern Europe to the cul-de-sacs of America in this hilarious and surprisingly deep film. *Hava Nagila (The Movie)* takes viewers from Ukraine and Israel to the Catskills, Greenwich Village and Hollywood, using the song as a springboard to explore Jewish history and identity and to spotlight the cross-cultural connections that can only be achieved through music.

3:15PM JUNE 30 • GENTLEMEN'S AGREEMENT (NR • 1 HR. 58 MINS.)



With a growing son to support, recently widowed journalist Phil Green (Gregory Peck) accepts the invitation of a magazine publisher to write a series of hard-hitting articles on the scourge of anti-Semitism. In order to glean his information first hand, Green decides to pose as a Jew. As the weeks go by, Green experiences all manner of prejudice, the most insidious being the subtle "gentleman's agreement" form of bigotry wherein anti-Jewish sentiments are merely taken for granted. He soon finds that even those who insist that they harbor no anti-Semitic feelings are also capable of prejudice.

3:00PM JULY 7 • AVALON (PG • 2 HRS.)



Avalon covers nearly 40 years in the lives of an immigrant Jewish family. Sam Krichinsky (Armin Mueller-Stahl) emigrates to Baltimore in 1914, where his brothers are awaiting his arrival. Sam meets his future wife, and with the introduction of the Krichinsky's grown son Jules, the film ventures into culture-clash country. Unwilling to become a manual laborer like his dad, Jules opts for the life of a door-to-door salesman, then teams with his cousin to open the first TV store in Baltimore. Thereafter, the disintegration of the Krichinsky family is paralleled by the rise of TV's omnipresence in the American home.

3:50PM JULY 14 • THE ZIGZAG KID (NR • 1 HR. 35 MINS.)



In this action-packed adventure that appeals to adults and children alike through its wit and humor, Nono, a nearly 13-year-old dreamer, longs to be a detective like his father, but his wild nature constantly gets him into trouble. Fed up with Nono's fantasies and antics, his father sends him off to his uncle's. On the train, Nono meets the charming international thief Felix Glick, an old acquaintance of his father's, with whom he travels to the French Riviera and enters a world of intrigue and pursuits, crossing paths with some whose secrets will change his life forever.
