Rosh Hodesh Elul "Sunrise" Service

The month of *Elul* (which immediately precedes Rosh Hashanah) is the time to prepare for the High Holy Days. Because these days are filled with so much meaning and potency, they require a special measure of readiness. At this service, we will greet the new month of Elul with anticipation of the beginning of a New Year, seeing it as an opportunity to begin to build our resolve to make the upcoming year of 5780 what we want and need it to be.

We'll include a number of readings in our regular liturgy in order to increase our awareness and resolve. And, as is our custom, we will sound the Shofar (as it is on every weekday of Elul) for the first time at the conclusion of the service.

Join us **Sunday, September 1 at 7:00am** on the Rabbi Arthur Oleisky Courtyard for this special moment, and bring your Shofar if you wish. Light refreshments will be offered following the service. (There will not be Minyan at 8:00am.)

Talmud on Tuesday

Learn about the law and lore in the "sea" of Talmud with Rabbi Robert Eisen as we dig deep into the "who, what, where, when, why and how" of living Judaism. Join us in the Epstein Chapel **immediately following 5:30pm Minyan**. (Not held October 1, 8, 15 & 22.)

Weekday Torah Study Group

Led by Rabbi Robert Eisen, this informal study group can lead to lively discussion. Held **Wednesdays** in the Library, **11:00am to 12noon**. (Not held October 2, 9 & 16.)

TZOM GEDALIAH Fast of Gedaliah

TZOM GEDALIAH (Fast of Gedaliah) is an annual fast day instituted by our tradition to mark the assassination of Gedaliah Ben Achikam, the Governor of Israel during the days of Nebuchadnezzar, the King of Babylonia. In the time immediately after the destruction of the Temple and of Jerusalem itself by the armies of Nebuchadnezzar, most of the Jewish people who lived in the land of Judah were exiled. There were a few that remained. Nebuchadnezzar appointed a man named Gedaliah as governor.

Gedaliah advised the people not to accept the Babylonian rule and instead to work towards reestablishing normal life in the country. Unfortunately, there were people who disagreed with him. A man named Yishmael ben Netaniah, a descendant of the royal family, murdered Gedaliah and many other Jews. This murder was the final blow that completely destroyed the last remnant of organized Jewish community in the land of Israel until the Jews returned to build the Second Temple.

The story of Gedaliah is told to us in two places: in the TaNaCh in Kings II chapter 25 and in the book of Jeremiah, chapters 40 and 41.

The "Fast" itself is considered a "Minor Fast" as it begins at daylight and not on the evening before. This year TZOM GEDALIAH falls on **Wednesday, October 2.**

SHABBAT SHUVAH October 4 – 5, 2019/ 6 Tishrei, 5780

The Shabbat between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur is called *Shabbat Shuvah*, *Shabbat of Return* because its special *haftarah* reading begins with the words *Shuvah Yisrael* "Return O Israel," from the prophecy of Hoshea. It is also referred to as *Shabbat Teshuvah* because it falls during the Ten Days of Repentance. The prayer service on this Shabbat is the same as on an ordinary Shabbat with the exception of the additions that are made to the *Amidah* throughout the Ten Days of Repentance.

It is customary in almost all Jewish communities for the rabbi of the city or congregation to expound on *teshuvah*, and to emphasize the severity of transgression so that the people turn their hearts toward repentance. Our Sages have said that when the wise address the people, God forgives the sins of Israel.

The Shabbat was given to Israel as a time for Torah study and prayer, and, although one should always take care not to pass the time idly or in inappropriate conversation, on *Shabbat Shuvah* one should be especially careful to concentrate entirely on Torah, prayer, and reflection on repentance, thereby attaining forgiveness for whatever unfitting behavior may have marred other Sabbaths.

From the President



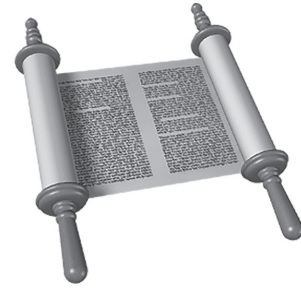

For centuries, every Jewish community maintained its own HEVRA KADISHA—a sacred fellowship whose members lovingly cleanse, dress and lay out the bodies of the dead until burial. And, our congregational community is no different.

Our HEVRA KADISHA participants are called on to fulfill the imperatives of *HESED SHEL EMET* (true kindness, or kindness at the moment of truth) for CAI members and their immediate relatives ... and sometimes, when available to help out other congregations in their time of need. *TAHARAH* (cleansing and dressing) is performed by a small group of participants - women for women, and men for men—under the guidance of an experienced team leader.

Our HEVRA KADISHA needs YOU!

As our community grows, so does our need to stay connected. Our HEVRA KADISHA continues to welcome additional members to our ranks for *TAHARAH* ... in order to respectfully enable the decedent to transition through death and burial in a dignified manner.

Training is included in our orientation process.

PROJECT ISAIAH



Every year, Congregation Anshei Israel participates in Tucson’s annual High Holy Days Hunger Project benefiting the Community Food Bank.

Independent of our particular levels of observance, *Yom Kippur* has an appeal which draws us back to the Synagogue year after year. The need to pause and get in touch with the way we are living our lives is universal and eternal. And especially as the day begins to draw to an end ... as the Gates of Heaven begin to close ... our passion for finding atonement ("at-one-ment") can be overwhelming. We pray, even as the Gates are closing: *Open for us the gates – at the hour of the closing of the gates. The day is nearly done. The sun is low; the day is growing late. O, let us come into Your gates at last.*

Though there are many "first steps" which can enable us to cross the threshold into the New Year — many different ways in which we can find the Gates of Heaven open to our hopes and dreams and prayers — we will again be continuing our "new tradition" which has given so many of us new meaning

to the day we know as *Yom Kippur*; new meaning to our hopes and dreams and prayers; new meaning to what life can still be.

For the entire repetition of *Ne'ilah*, as we stand before the open *Aron Kodesh*, symbolizing the Gates of Heaven which remain open to our heartfelt supplication, as our *Hazzan* lifts our prayer on the wings of her own, you will be invited (individually, or with your family) to come up to the *bimah*, approach the *Aron Kodesh* and stand before it to offer the prayers you feel deep in your heart. Some may feel a bit self-conscious, but if you allow yourself to open your heart, your soul, and your mind, you may find the intimacy of the moment (the intimacy which we can achieve between ourselves and God) to be the most meaningful moment of the entire High Holy Days season.

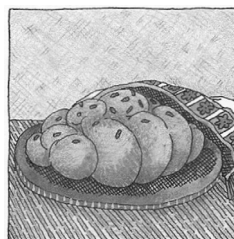


Final Shofar at Ne'ilah Service

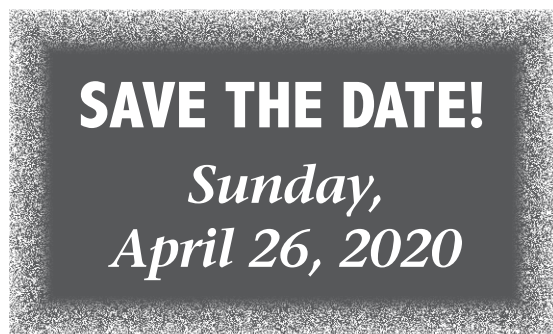

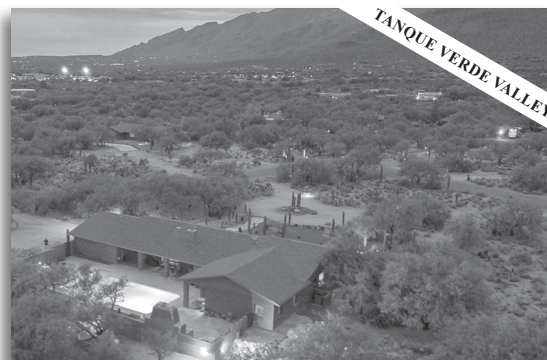
