The Tenth of Tevet Asarah B'Tevet

Date of the fast in 5780: January 17, 2020

Coming as it does a week after the last day of Hanukkah, the fast on the 10th of the month of Tevet (Asarah B'Tevet) might easily be overlooked. It occupies, however, an important niche in the story of Israel and the history of our people.

The text in II Kings (25:1-4) tells us that on the 10th day of the 10th month, in the ninth year of his reign, (588 BCE), Nebuchadnezzar, the Babylonian king, began the siege of Jerusalem. Three years later, on the 17th of Tammuz, he broke through the city walls. The siege ended with the destruction of the Temple three weeks later, on the 9th of Av, the end of the first Kingdom and the exile of the Jewish people to Babylon. It can thus be considered part of the cycle of fasts connected with these events: Tzom Gedaliah (3rd of Tishrei); Shivah Asar B'Tammuz (17th of Tammuz) and Tisha B'Av (9th of Av).

The first mention of this fast appears in Zechariah (8:19) where it is called the "fast of the tenth month..." (counting from the month of Nisan, which was the first month in Biblical times). Other references to the fast and the affliction can be found in Ezekiel 24:1-2 (the siege); Jeremiah 52:4-6.

However, although the fast is historically tied in with events surrounding the destruction of the First Temple, the purpose of the fast is not the commemoration of an historical event, but the state of affliction of the Jewish people.

- As with all Jewish fasts, the prayers for Asarah B'Tevet include Selihot, marking the day as an occasion for each of us to devote time to Teshuvah (repentance), the introspection that motivates us to reexamine our actions and change our ways. As the Talmud in Brachot says, "one who is afflicted should examine his or her actions and do Teshuvah."
- Asarah B'Tevet is the day of mourning for people whose last resting place or date of death is unknown (the Kaddish Clali).
- Asarah B'Tevet is one of four public fasts which begin at dawn (alot hashachar about an hour before sunrise), but do not carry additional restrictions, such as washing oneself or wearing leather shoes, etc. (while Yom Kippur and Tisha B'Av begin from dusk the night before). However, it is the only fast which is not brought forward or postponed if it falls on a Friday, a mark of its immense significance.



Daily Minyan Services & "Jewry" Duty

Our Minyan is expected to be there when someone needs to say Kaddish, but there are times when it is difficult to get a Minyan. Along with your "Jewry Duty," please consider being part of the Minyan at least one morning or afternoon per month on a regular basis. Service times

are on the calendar in each newsletter and on CAI's website. Shown below is a combined list of Minyan attendees and those fulfilling their "Jewry" Duty during August and September. Todah rabah!

For centuries, every Jewish community maintained its own HEVRA KADISHA-a sacred fellowship whose members lovingly cleanse, dress and lay out the bodies of the dead until burial. And, our congregational community is no different.

Our HEVRA KADISHA participants are called on to fulfill the imperatives of HESED SHEL EMET (true kindness, or kindness at the moment of truth) for CAI members and their immediate relatives ... and sometimes, when available to help out other congregations in their time of need. TAHARAH (cleansing and dressing) is performed by a small group of participants - women for women, and men for men-under the guidance of an experienced team leader.

Our HEVRA KADISHA needs YOU!

As our community grows, so does our need to stay connected. Our HEVRA KADISHA continues to welcome additional members to our ranks for TAHARAH ... in order to respectfully enable the decedent to transition through death and burial in a dignified manner.

Training is included in our orientation process. The only prerequisite is an open heart.

From the President

As the Judaic music teacher at Anshei Israel for a couple of decades, I got to sing songs with our religious school children for all of the various holidays. By far, the holiday with the best variety of music was Hanukkah. This may have something to do with the nearness of Hanukkah to

Christmas, as many musicians put out a Christmas album since they sell so well. Likewise, Jewish musicians would put out a Hanukkah album, although many of them put out Christmas albums as well; Mel Torme as one example. One of the most interesting flips on this was former Senator Orrin Hatch, a member of the LDS Church, who composed and published "Eight Days of Hanukkah" in 2009. There are traditional Hanukkah songs, Israeli Hanukkah songs, modern Hanukkah songs, and many other variations. It's a pretty impressive catalog for a minor Jewish holiday. Adam Sandler has had great success with his successive iterations of "The Chanukah Song," now I believe on Part IV. For background music, I like some of the jazz/swing albums from the likes of Jon Simon and Kenny Ellis.

More recently though, the tradition has become to put out an *a cappella* parody cover of popular songs. The Maccabeats really started this trend with "Candlelight," a parody cover of Taio Cruz's song "Dynamite" in 2010. Last year saw an extraordinary example with "Bohemian Chanukah" by Six13, a cover parody of Queen's "Bohemian Rhapsody." You can find all of these on YouTube, Spotify, Jewish Rock Radio, or the other innumerable online music sources. I would also recommend *oySongs.com* where not only can you find a huge amount of Jewish music for your own collection, but you can give an "oyGelt Gift Certificate" as a fun present. So this year as you are unwrapping presents after lighting the Hanukkiah, throw on some good Hanukkah music and enjoy a *freilach* (happy) holiday of freedom. Also, please remember to join us for our Community Hanukkah Party on December 29.

From the Executive Director

I want to begin with a big **TODAH RABAH** to our amazing group of lay leaders, clergy and staff who helped us execute an exceptional High Holy Days season! We started it with a meaningful inter-synagogue collaboration which allowed us to place two ads in the Arizona Jewish Post as a group to highlight



what we all share, the importance and beauty of the season. Our Rosh Hashanah, Kol Nidre and Yom Kippur services went smoothly, our children enjoyed parallel youth services and we cleared the parking lot in less than 20 minutes after the blowing of the final shofar. We had over 100 community members listen to Richard Green in our sukkah and we enjoyed delicious food during our many Sukkot festivities. We partnered with Hillel and anonymous donors who were willing to underwrite transportation and dinner costs for college students so they could join us. We danced with our Torahs and blessed our pets; now we're moving forward with the rest of our calendar. Many of you may feel like the holiday rush is behind us; however, things do not slow down for the staff. We are diligently working on many projects behind the scenes.

We held Focus Groups, gathered information in our congregational survey, and now our Strategic Development/Rabbinic Transition Task Force has used that data to finalize our application through the Rabbinic Assembly, and we are eagerly awaiting our future candidates. We will continue to update the congregation. We have also been promoting "The Greatest Send-Off on Earth" to be held April 26, 2020. Make sure to add it to your calendar. (Hint: You won't want to miss it!)

Security remains a priority for me and CAI. We have continued to hold advanced security trainings and have been able to invite other Jewish agencies in our community to join us for them here at CAI. We have numerous advanced emergency kits placed around our building. We are constantly reevaluating our needs and reassessing what we can do to further protect our community and our building.

Homeland Security offers a Non-Profit Security Grant each year. Being outside the Phoenix metro-area, there are limited funds available for a large group of applicants. This year a cap of \$150,000 was available for all the non-profits in the state (outside the Phoenix metro-area) with a maximum request of \$75,000 per non-profit organization. At least once a year, we have a Threats and Vulnerability Assessment performed by Homeland Security, which provided me with the information I needed to write the grant. The grant process was long and arduous, but I'm very pleased to announce that Congregation Anshei Israel was awarded the full \$75,000! We are the only agency that was awarded this security grant in Southern Arizona, which will allow us to further secure our facility. Some of these upgrades you will notice and some you will not, which is exactly how we remain secure.

I continue to further my education so that I'm successful whenever and wherever I represent CAI. I am attending another conference in December in Chicago with a focus on "Navigating New Realities."

Looking forward to sharing delicious Le Cave's donuts with you at our "Hanukkah Pajamakkah" on December 29! (see page 7 for details). As always, feel free to contact me at any time.





Stitching the Torah

Torah Stitch by Stitch is a project conceived by Toronto textile and Judaica artist Temma Gentles in 2013 after she was invited to take part in an exhibition on religious art by women at the Mishkan Museum of Art in Ein Harod, Israel. To address the staggering numbers involved in executing the project — the Torah has 5856 verses and 304,805 letters — Gentles devised a system where each participant receives a kit with four verses to stitch onto a panel. Individuals pay \$18 and commit to completing the panel within six months. The kit includes a paper cross-stitch pattern of the verses, typically assigned in order of appearance in the Torah; a needle; black embroidery floss; and the canvas panel. Once completed, the panels are mailed back to Gentles and sewn together. People from around the world are participating in the project. Once completed in 2020, the stitched Torah will include close to 2000 panels. While a regular Torah scroll fully unrolled can reach 115 to 150 feet, these panels when sewn together will be 300 feet — the length of a football field!

The project leaders are looking for a museum partner to exhibit the entire completed scroll and funding to make it possible.
