


"Matza & More" Passover Food Drive March I - 24

From the President

On April 26th, we will have an opportunity to honor and recognize the contributions over the last two decades of Rabbi Robert J. Eisen. Like Moses leading the Israelites through the Sinai Desert, Rabbi Eisen has been our spiritual guide in the Sonoran Desert, albeit for half the time. As Immediate Past

President Stephanie Roberts has relayed, everyone has a story about how Rabbi Eisen has touched their lives. Whether it is helping folks in times of distress, posing thought-provoking questions during a sermon, or making a simcha "that much more," Rabbi Eisen has had a tremendous impact on the lives of our congregants. He has certainly been the hardest working rabbi around. No matter what day or what time of day, you could hardly walk into the building and not run into him as he was dashing from service to appointment, to meeting, to class.

What we hardly ever saw though was what Rabbi Eisen did in the background, as he almost never talks about himself or all of the things he does. A small sample of background activities I have recently caught him doing include chairing the Tucson Board of Rabbis, co-chairing the Jewish Community Roundtable, serving on the Tucson Hebrew High board, giving such a moving invocation at a Pima County Board of Supervisors meeting that he was asked for a copy of his address, participating in an interfaith dialogue and answering questions for AP Human Geography students at University High School, and writing an op-ed piece for the Arizona Daily Star. I also caught him taking a vacation day once. Once.

Rabbi Eisen has unquestionably earned some rest and relaxation, and his retirement from Anshei Israel is well earned. In consequence, the Board of Trustees has voted to honor Rabbi Eisen with the title of Rabbi Emeritus and maintain his affiliation with our synagogue. I hope you too can join us on April 26th to wish him congratulations in person and help us to recognize all of his contributions in our bound keepsake journal for the Eisen family.

It is a truism that whoever will be our next rabbi will have big shoes to fill. It is important that we find someone who is a good fit for our congregation and we need everyone's input. Thank you to everyone who has participated in our rabbinic candidate weekends and provided us feedback. Please continue to be involved and let us know your thoughts.


The Mitzvah of Bikur Holim



And now we're all getting ready for the megillah reading, Purim costume parade and hamantashen, followed by our Model Seder and Passover. And you know what that means? 
