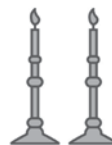
Let your voice be heard - become a Meturgeman!

FROM THE PRESIDENT



TGI Chanukkah, seriously. A fun, home-based holiday to take our minds off of COVID-19. Lighting candles, spinning dreidels, and eating latkes. What's not to like? When I ask B'nai Mitzvah students what their favorite Jewish holiday is, the most common answer is Chanukkah. Why? Because presents. But Chanukkah has deeper meanings than just fun. One is the celebration of miracles. There

are miracles that we experience on a daily basis that we take for granted or we are too busy to notice. Certainly, we should be thankful for all of the wonders *Hashem* has bestowed upon us. Chanukkah presents an opportune time to stop, smell the roses, and be thankful.

Another meaning of Chanukkah is the triumph of tradition over assimilation. This seems to be a never-ending battle to be fought and one in which the institution of the synagogue has been at the forefront. A 2019 Gallup poll found that the number of Americans who were members of a religious institution had dropped from 70% in 1999 to only 50%. The same poll also found that roughly 50% of Jewish respondents were members of synagogues in 2019. We know that the Conservative Movement has experienced contraction as well. However, one of the findings of the 2013 Pew Research Center survey of U.S. Jewry was that members of Conservative synagogues still reported high Jewish identity, participation, and observance. My takeaway is if Judaism will continue to survive and thrive in the coming decades, it will be because of the synagogue. Ahad Ha'am said, "More than the Jewish People have kept Shabbat, Shabbat has kept the Jews." Similarly, synagogues are the future for the Jewish people outside of Israel, and without them there will be no successive generations.

So as we remember the fight of the Maccabees for the freedom to practice their religion and their rejection of Greek assimilation, let's keep in mind the importance of the synagogue in the fight for Jewish continuity. 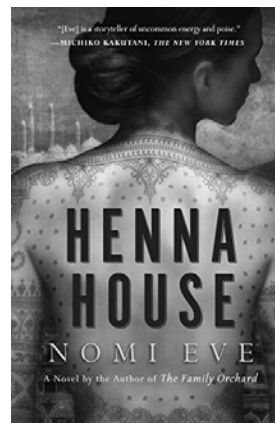

Each week a different theme and color are used to capture their students' imaginations and inner artists. Creative and instructional centers such as painting, books, puzzles, dance, as well as fine and gross motor activities are what makes their classroom radiate with excitement.

Ms. Abigail, Ms. Emiliya and Ms. Elizabeth have their students twinkling like the *Kochavim* (stars) they are. With multiple learning and activity areas, the students have plenty of room to explore and play while working together in a positive environment. 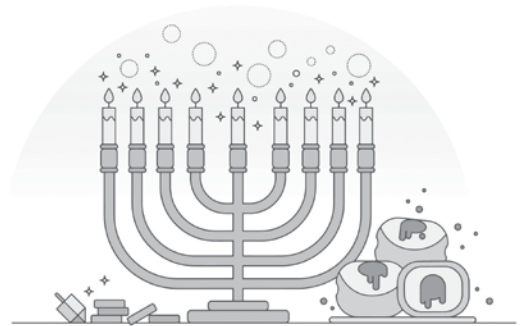

Blessings for the Chanukkah Lights



On the first night all three blessings are recited, and on succeeding nights only the first two.

1. *Baruch Atta Adonai, Elohenu Melech Ha'Olam, Asher Kiddishanu B'Mitsvotav V'Tzivanu L'Hadlik Ner Shel Chanukkah.*

Blessed are Thou, Lord our God, King of the Universe, who has sanctified us with Thy commandments and has commanded us to kindle the Chanukkah light.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה ה', אֱלֹהֵינוּ
אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתֶיךָ, וְצִוֵּנוּ
לְהַדְלִיק נֵר שֶׁל חֲנוּכָּה.

2. *Baruch Atta Adonai, Elohenu Melech Ha'Olam, She'asah Nissim La'Avotenu Bayamim Ha'Hem Ba'Zeman Ha'Zeh.*
Blessed are Thou, Lord our God, King of the Universe, who didst perform miracles for our ancestors in those days at this season.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה ה', אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם,
שֶׁעָשָׂה נִסִּים לְאַבוֹתֵינוּ,
בַּיָּמִים הָהֵם וּבַזְּמַן הַזֶּה.

The following blessing is chanted only the first night:

3. *Baruch Atta Adonai, Elohenu Melech Ha'Olam, Sheh'Hecheyanu V'Kimanyu, V'Hig Giyanu La'Zeman Ha'Zeh.*

Blessed are Thou, Lord our God, King of the Universe, who has granted us life and sustained us, and brought us to this season.

In What Order Do We Light the Chanukkah Candles?

Many people question the order in which the Chanukkah candles should be lit. The correct way to light a Chanukkah is while standing facing the front of your Chanukkah, insert the candles into the holder from the right to left, not counting the *shamash*. On the first night, insert one candle; on the second night, insert two, etc. Always work from right to left. When lighting the candles, use the *shamash* to light the candles from left to right. In this way the candle representing the new night is always lit first.

The Tenth of Tevet

Asarah B'Tevet

Date of the fast in 5781:

DECEMBER 25, 2020

Coming as it does a week after the last day of Chanukkah, the fast on the 10th of the month of Tevet (*Asarah B'Tevet*) might easily be overlooked. It occupies, however, an important niche in the story of Israel and the history of our people.

The text in II Kings (25:1-4) tells us that on the 10th day of the 10th month, in the ninth year of his reign, (588 BCE), Nebuchadnezzar, the Babylonian king, began the siege of Jerusalem. Three years later on the 17th of Tammuz, he broke through the city walls. The siege ended with the destruction of the Temple three weeks later, on the 9th of Av, marking the end of the first Kingdom and the exile of the Jewish people to Babylon. It can thus be considered part of the cycle of fasts connected with these events: *Tzom Gedaliah* (3rd of Tishrei); *Shivah Asar B'Tammuz* (17th of Tammuz) and *Tisha B'Av* (9th of Av).

The first mention of this fast appears in Zechariah (8:19), where it is called the "fast of the tenth month..." (counting from the month of Nisan, the first month in Biblical times). Other references to the fast and the affliction can be found in Ezekiel 24:1-2 (the siege); Jeremiah 52:4-6.

Although the fast is historically tied in with the events surrounding the destruction of the First Temple, the purpose of the fast is not the commemoration of an historical event, but the state of affliction of the Jewish people.

As with all Jewish fasts, the prayers for *Asarah B'Tevet* include Selichot, marking the day as an occasion for each of us to devote time to *Teshuvah* (repentance), the introspection that motivates us to reexamine our actions and change our ways. As the Talmud in Brachot says, "one who is afflicted should examine his or her actions and do *Teshuvah*."

Asarah B'Tevet is the day of mourning for people whose last resting place or date of death is unknown (the *Kaddish Clali*).

Asarah B'Tevet is one of four public fasts which begin at dawn (*alot hashachar* - about an hour before sunrise), but do not carry additional restrictions, such as washing oneself or wearing leather shoes, etc. (while Yom Kippur and Tisha B'Av begin from dusk the night before). However, it is the only fast which is not brought forward or postponed if it falls on a Friday, a mark of its immense significance.

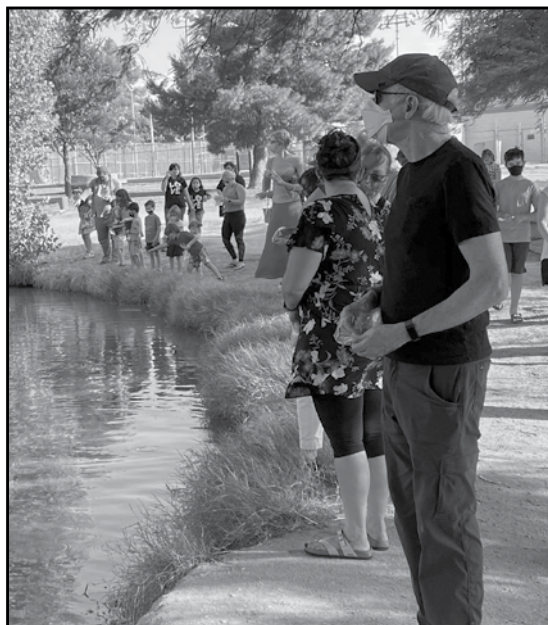
In-Person Shofar Blasts

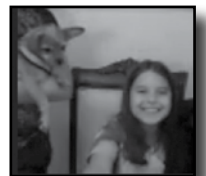
