

FROM THE PRESIDENT



The wait for the highly anticipated widespread COVID-19 vaccine rollout continues. In the meantime, while we have been limited in what we can do, additional online programming opportunities will be increased. Please watch for some of our new Adult Education programs in particular.

In February we celebrate Tu B'Shvat, the New Year of the Trees. It celebrates the time when the earliest fruits in Israel begin to emerge in the Spring. I think we can take some consolation from this observance given our current plight. Each year, many trees go through a cycle of life, growth, bringing forth fruit, diminishment with leaves falling, dormancy, and then rebirth again. We celebrate this life cycle and contribute to it by planting our own seeds that will one day participate and grow into trees. Even in the dark days of winter when everything seems sad and lifeless, there is a light at the end of the tunnel. Spring will come and the fruits of our labor will see sunlight and growth. While 2020 was certainly a tough year, 2021 is a new year and there is a light at the end of the tunnel. Eventually, we will see the other side where we can grow and thrive. Still, it's never too late to plant seeds.

The Talmud (Ta'anit 23a:15) relates a story about Choni HaMe'agel, famous for successfully praying for rain from within a circle he drew. Choni was walking along the road when he saw a man planting a carob tree. Choni asked him how long it would take for the tree to bear fruit. The man answered, "70 years." Choni asked him if he expected to live for another 70 years to benefit from the fruit. The man replied that there were carob trees already here for me to enjoy, and so I am just paying it forward and planting for my descendants.

So, let's focus on planting what seeds we can now (real and metaphorical). Maybe we will personally benefit from these seeds when they mature into trees, but maybe these are seeds that individuals in the future will benefit from as well.





About Tu B'Shvat

The semi-holiday, Chamishah Asar B'Shvat (15th day of Shvat) marks the first day of spring in Israel. It occurs six weeks after Chanukkah. The Mishnah refers to it as Rosh Hashanah L'Ilanot (New Year of the Trees). Since ancient times, the Jewish people have observed it by eating fruit grown in Israel. With the rise of the Zionist movement and the re-establishment of the land of Israel, Tu B'Shvat has gained new significance as Arbor Day, observed by the planting of trees in Israel.

Trees were regarded as special gifts from God. There are many symbolic allusions to trees in the Bible, especially the olive, which sends up new shoots to continue the life of the old tree that dies. Trees are represented as symbols of goodness and nobility. The upright person is compared to "a tree planted near a stream, that bears fruit in due season, with leaves that never fade" (Psalm 1:3). "The righteous will flourish like the palm tree; they will grow like a cedar in Lebanon" (Psalm 92: 13-14).

Not too long ago, it was customary among many of our people to plant a tree when a child was born. Branches from these trees were then used for the poles of the wedding canopy (*chuppah*) on the day of their marriage.

In our day, many people purchase trees in Israel through the Jewish National Fund (JNF). If interested in purchasing a tree or making a donation to the JNF for reclamation of the land of Israel, please contact the JNF at 800-542-TREE (8733).

This year Tu B'Shvat falls on Thursday, January 28 (it begins at sundown January 27).

About Purim

Purim tells the story of Esther and Haman, and begins with a feast in the kingdom of Persia, hosted by King Ahashverosh. The king was flaunting his riches and treasures for all to see, and decided that his beautiful wife, Queen Vashti, should also be displayed. But when the king sent for Vashti, she refused to appear before him. In anger, he threw Vashti out of the palace. In search of a new wife, the king chose Esther, a young and very beautiful Jewish woman. Esther's uncle, Mordecai, cautioned her not to tell the king that she was a Jew.

King Ahashverosh bestowed a special honor on Haman, his power-hungry assistant, telling all the people in his kingdom to bow down to Haman. As a Jew, Mordecai refused. Haman became enraged and devised a plan to kill all the Jews. He even bribed the king into signing the declaration.

To determine the date the Jews were to be attacked, Haman drew lots ("*purim*" in Hebrew). Mordecai, however, discovered Haman's evil scheme and revealed it to Esther. Esther decided she must tell Ahashverosh, even if it meant her life.

King Ahashverosh was horrified to learn that his beautiful wife and her people were in danger. Haman was condemned to be hanged on the gallows and Mordecai was elevated to the position of Prime Minister. The Jews were safe once again, and Esther and Mordecai proclaimed the day to be one of feasting and merrymaking.









