

Rabbi Emeritus Arthur Oleisky, of blessed memory



Rabbi Arthur Oleisky, z''l passed away on Shabbat morning, October 16, 2021. Rabbi Oleisky was a visionary leader of Congregation Anshei Israel from 1970-1999, always leading with his heart and love for our community.

In his heart, Rabbi Oleisky was a teacher and a shepherd, giving time, wisdom, and care answering questions and giving advice.

Connection was so deeply important to Rabbi Oleisky. He and Betejoy led many congregational Israel trips to solidify connections, aiding this community to be Anshei Yisrael, the children of Israel. He felt it integral to reach out to our young families and further to encourage Jewish summer camps, specifically Ramah.

Rabbi Oleisky had a quiet, humble, and powerful presence. He lead with his heart and with great love. (Nichole and I deeply appreciate and owe everything to his strength to move Anshei Israel to be more accepting and seeing women as equals). He led the congregation into an egalitarian era. Yet he never saw anyone defined by anything other than their soul, He saw everyone as an individual, as someone created in the image of God. Rabbi Oleisky loved teaching, sharing his love of Judaism, and Torah with others. He also especially loved helping other rabbis. I am deeply appreciative and would like to share his words with you. A few weeks before he passed, he told me, "Judaism values life. We must do and continue to act. You cannot wait for things to happen, sometimes you have to make them happen."

On the day of his passing, we read of Avram and Sarai's journey to Canaan, where they made a covenant with God and grew into their new names as Avraham and Sarah. Following the example of our honored ancestors, Rabbi Oleisky along with his wife, Betejoy, embodied the value of *Hachnasat Orchim*, welcoming in countless people to Anshei Israel, Judaism, and to God.

Rabbi Oleisky's legacy continues through his students' and community members' engagement with and commitment to Judaism, Israel, and his beloved Camp Ramah. May his memory be a blessing. *-Rabbi Sara Metz*

Preschool

The cooler months find our little ones enjoying more outside time working on physical activities and strengthening their gross motor skills. Climbing, swinging, running, balancing, building in the sand, and riding tricycles are all part of a well-rounded

education, and part of the Arizona Department of Health Services Empower Program which our preschool is a part of.

As one of the 2,400 statewide licensed childcare facilities in Arizona, our preschool uses a wide variety of Empower activities and standards set forth by the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS), to empower children to learn healthy habits for life. Some of these activities and standards include providing at least 60 minutes of daily physical activity, teaching sun safety, having the children wear sunscreen and sun hats whenever outside even in the cooler weather, as well as, teaching healthy eating habits and providing healthy daily snacks to our students twice a day. Annual training for our teaching staff to stay up-to-date on Empower topics is also included. By being associated with the Empower Program, we as a preschool receive a 50% discount on our state licensing fees.

Just like the Mighty Maccabees that our students are learning about for Chanukkah, through the Empower Program, each child is learning to be strong, not just in mind and spirit, but in body as well. Feeling proud, capable and confident, even at a young age, is magical, and just like the oil in the Eternal Light, has the power to last a lifetime.

May the light of the Chanukkiah empower us all, and may we be blessed with health, happiness, and love in 2022.
