YIZKOR

Yizkor – remembrance; remembrance and acceptance. The loss of our loved ones is real; the pain of parting from them is real. We cannot find consolation in illusion. We accept life and death as they are, as God created them. Death is a mystery. Yet life itself is no less a mystery. Who can explain how so much beauty, so much goodness, so much purpose and love could emerge from primeval chaos? We accept death as real, and balance the sorrow of this moment with the goodness and joy we have known in the past.

Yizkor – a time to remember all those out of reach of our arms but not out of reach of our spirits...

Yizkor – remembrance; remembrance and perspective. *Yizkor* bids us also to look at our lives. This requires calm and patience. If we grasp the hand of time instead of refusing it, and sit in quietude, we might discover the kind of person we ought to be. This quiet is as beneficial to the soul as food is to the body. "Remembrance," said the sage, "leads to redemption."

EL MOLEI RACHAMIM

This is a prayer for the repose of the dead that first came into usage in Poland in the seventeenth century following the martyrdom of many Jews. Today it is considered the standard memorial prayer for the dead.

The translation is as follows:

Exalted, compassionate God, grant infinite rest in Your sheltering presence, among the holy and the pure, to the souls of all our beloved who have gone to their eternal home. Merciful One, we ask that our loved ones find perfect peace in Your tender embrace, their memory enduring as inspiration for commitment to their ideals and integrity in our lives. May their souls thus be bound up in the bond of life. May they rest in peace. And let us say: Amen.

THE TRADITION OF THE KADDISH

The origins of the *Kaddish* are mysterious; angels are said to have brought it down from heaven...

It possesses wonderful power. Truly, if there is any bond strong enough to chain heaven to earth, it is this prayer. It keeps the living together, and forms a bridge to the mysterious realm of the dead. One might almost say that this prayer is the guardian of the people by whom alone it is uttered; therein lies the warrant of its continuance. Can a people disappear and be annihilated so long as children remember their parents?

Because this prayer does not acknowledge death, because it permits the blossom, which has fallen from the tree of humankind, to flower and develop again in the human heart, therefore it possesses sanctifying power.

MOURNER'S KADDISH

Amidst the sorrow of our bereavement, we lift our hearts to You, O God, for comfort and consolation. Help us to resist the shadows of despair that darken our lives. Help us find strength in the knowledge that those we have lost were not ours by right, but Your gift to us. Teach us to be grateful for the blessing of their lives, and for the time they were granted to walk this world by our side. May their memories continue to inspire us and to bring us blessing.
