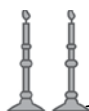
OFFICE NEWS

Preschool



In the midst of the conflict in Israel, our small preschool remains a sanctuary of innocence and safety for our young ones. Their teachers continue to foster an atmosphere of love and learning and the children have been shielded from the stressors of the outside world. Although it doesn't quite feel like it yet, fall is here and the children have now settled beautifully into their new classes and routines.

There have been several new developments at the preschool in the past couple months that have provided the children with some new opportunities for play and exploration. Our former kindergarten classroom has been completely revamped and transformed into our new STEAM Lab. STEAM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics. This innovative new classroom gives our students more opportunities for hands-on exploration, thinking critically and problem solving, collaboration, enjoying imaginative play, and integrating arts while learning about various STEAM concepts. In addition, the patio outside of our STEAM Lab that is on the north end of our playground has brand-new shade sails to give the children more room for outdoor learning. This allows two of the shared classrooms to extend their learning spaces to a shaded patio area. We are looking forward to utilizing the space when we prepare to replant our garden in the upcoming month!

Other assets to our preschool program here at CAI include the many opportunities for learning through music. On Friday mornings, we celebrate Shabbat and have the privilege of being led in joyous celebration by our Cantorial Soloist Nichole Chorny. The children also look forward to jamming with our good friend Mr. Nature every Wednesday. His visits are always so much fun, and he provides the children access to various instruments, dancing, opportunities for self-expression, active listening skills, among many other benefits. Our newest music enrichment class is provided by one of our preschool parents, Maxi Larrea, who is an accomplished classical guitarist, composer, director, and music educator. He will not only be teaching our children about a different style of music, but the Spanish language as well. *Anamos la música!*

The talented teachers and staff at our preschool are committed to providing a well-rounded and nurturing educational experience for our preschoolers, even during this difficult time.

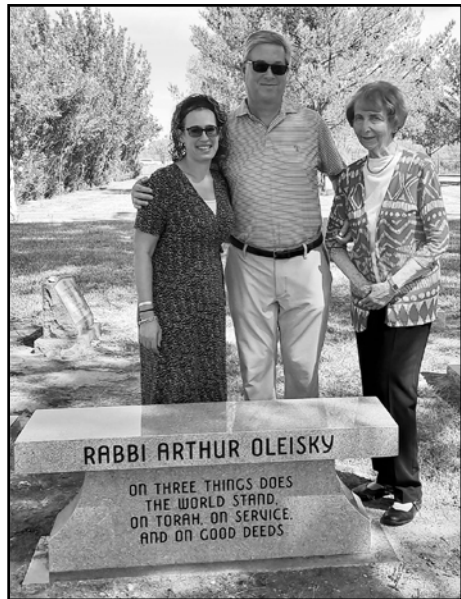

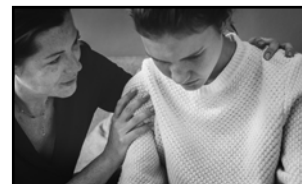
