FROM RABBI METZ

In March of 2019, my family was in a dark time, and we held tight to any small amount of light of hope we had. My two-and-a-half year old son, Eitan, had kidney cancer. Our families and community truly brought us through his surgery and then about 9 months of chemo, many week-long hospital stays, and radiation treatment.



During that time it was almost impossible for us to see that we would get through this time. One day a new doctor came in to talk to us in the hospital. She had on professional dress, a white coat and a nose ring. She sat with us, listened and gave us hope that we could get through this nightmare, and there was a glimmer of light.

Earlier this fall we read in the Torah about Abraham sending his servant(we call him Eliezer) to get a wife for Isaac. Eliezer prays for a sign, for a glimmer of hope. It is then that he sees a young woman, Rebecca, at the well. She gives him water, and more for his camels.

Eliezer sees Rebecca's kindness as that sign or symbol and glimmer of hope. He gives Rebecca gifts to show his appreciation in hopes that she will give her consent to becoming Isaac's wife. Those gifts include a golden nose ring.

The story continues that Rebecca brings Eliezer back to her home. The family sees the gifts including the nose ring, and they believe that these too are symbols that Rebecca will have a good life as Isaac's spouse. Rebecca then agrees to leave with Eliezer, and to marry Isaac.

In this story, the gifts of jewelry, and specifically a nose ring, are a sign. Eliezer gives Rebecca these gifts after seeing her kindness to him and his camels. These materials objects give them hope and comfort for a better future.

Back to the hospital with Eitan in 2019. When the doctor left, we saw a glimmer and sparkle of hope for our future. At that time, I had wanted to find a way to add a bit more sparkle, glimmer, hope and light to my life. It was in that moment that I decided to give myself a reminder of hope and light. I could project that to the world and see it every time I looked in the mirror.

For me this glimmer of hope, was a connector to my ancient mother, Rebecca. She was given this nose ring as a gift, as a symbol of what her future could be. I decided that I would get a nose ring too as a reminder of that sign from God of light and hope for a better future.

In these times when many of us are frightened and the light of hope is almost all dimmed, we must find small ways to remind ourselves that we are strong. This glimmer also helps us to know when our light is dimmed, while another is there to hold us how to shine their light until ours is strong again.

Hope is not something that is easy to hold, light is not either. It is so easy to descend into anger, fear and negativity. That is why we need each other, That is why we each need something to remind ourselves that we must strive towards light.

What is your sign or symbol to yourself that helps bring you comfort? It might be a note in your wallet, the picture on your phone home screen, a piece of jewelry, silly socks or something else. It is different for everyone, yet regardless of the symbol for you, never let it go. We need reminders of light and hope. May God strengthen us and Israel with a glimmer and sparkle of hope.

FROM THE PRESIDENT



October 7th changed our world in many ways, and in many ways it reminded us of historical issues we face as Jews. Not only have there been attacks on Israel directly, but the rise in antisemitism across the world is palpable. Ironic that as we approach Purim, the theme of that holiday is antisemitism. We all know the story that Queen Esther saved our people

by bringing Haman's antisemitic actions to light. In much the same way as Esther, it is our responsibility not to sit idly by and let these actions be normalized, but to bring them to light as the despicable acts that they are.

Unfortunately, as of the time this is being written, there are still over 130 hostages being held by Hamas. This means they are likely to miss both Chanukkah and Purim, two of the most joyous holidays celebrated in Israel. Many soldiers who are protecting the State of Israel will also likely have a muted celebration, at best. Again, it is ironic that Chanukkah also comes at a time when Israel protects herself as the Maccabees did some long ago. As a congregation, we must continue to stand in solidarity with Israel as they protect themselves for now and for the future generations. There will be time later to discuss how this happened as well as the tactics Israel chose in the war against Hamas and in the hostage returns, but for now we must all stand with Israel unequivocally.

our students with hands-on activities that will teach them the importance of nurturing, growth, delayed gratification, and we hope they will get to taste some of the fruits of their labor in the near future!


We are grateful for the beautiful memories and shared experiences from 2023, and we eagerly look forward to another year of learning, laughter, and love within our close-knit preschool community.






