# FROM RABBI METZ

On both Purim and Passover we tell the story of our people's survival. On Purim we read the story in the Megillah of Esther's strength, intelligence, and beauty in saving the Jewish people of Persia. On Passover our entire Seder is focused around telling the story of our slavery and exodus from Egypt.



In our Torah, in Exodus 12:26 & 13:14, we have two instances of God instructing Moses and the people how to ensure the continuation of Judaism, Jewish practice, and Jewish belief. The text states that when your child sees you preparing for Passover and asks you "Mah zot? What is this?" You tell them the story of our exodus from Egypt.

Telling the story of our exodus from Egypt is not limited to the words in our Torah and in the Haggadah that we read at the Passover Seder. We also need to be able to answer for ourselves the questions of "Mah zot? What is this?" with our own stories, our own experiences of redemption and revelation. What if your story had led you to exactly this moment? What are your Passover memories?

Maybe your story includes cleaning and cooking for days with your family preparing, or that one Passover seder night in which a neighbor who dressed in a dark robe and knocked on your door exclaiming that they were Elijiah. Or you remember on-line seders of 2020 and beyond. Maybe you attended your first Passover seder ever last year and have since joined the Jewish community. No matter your history, we all have a story.

Our service to God and the Jewish community is not always easy. It is in these moments that we need to tell the story of how we were slaves in Egypt, and God brought us out with signs and miracles. When we can connect to the stories of our past, we can see the miracles of our present.

# FROM THE PRESIDENT



I had the opportunity to attend the "Lunch and Learn" event when the Czech Torah was brought to Anshei Israel as part of its restoration week. The Torah, which was gifted to Congregation Chaverim back in 1976, is one of over 1500 saved from the Holocaust through the efforts of a trust based in

London. I learned a great deal about the Torah writing process that I did not otherwise know, but one thing in particular stuck with me from that event.

We continue to write Torahs in the same way as we have for thousands of years. Sure, there are subtle differences in the parchment, threading or writing style, but at the end of the day it is largely the same. This is true despite the advent of the printing press and mass publication techniques as well as, of course more recently, any number of digital techniques for printing that could be employed. By continuing this tradition and resisting the temptations of modern invention, we connect ourselves with all those who have come before us.

This connection to our ancestors is also a major theme of Pesach. As we will soon sit at the Pesach table, we yet again all strive to be the "Wise Son" who self identifies with his ancestors and their struggle for freedom, as if he, himself had been there. May we all benefit from the gift of Freedom in this Pesach season!






