

Shalom! FROM RABBI METZ

As we approach the High Holy Days and our Fall Festivals, we gather together with friends, family and our Anshei Israel family to celebrate the new year. During the High Holy Days, we have a number of different greetings we offer each other. Each has its own unique meaning and blessing.



Here's a guide to the different greetings you might hear or use during the High Holy Day Season. We wish them all to you!

Shanah Tovah (שנה טובה): "A good year." This is said throughout the High Holy days as a blessing that the person should have a "good year." Some also say, "Shanah Tovah Umetukah," meaning "A good and sweet year."

L'Shanah Tovah Tikatevu (לשנה טובה תכתבו): "May you be inscribed (in the Book of Life) for a good year." This greeting incorporates the theological belief that from Rosh Hashanah through Yom Kippur, God inscribes the fate of each person for the coming year in the Book of Life.

Ketivah Vachatimah Tovah (כתיבה טובה): "A good inscription and sealing (in the Book of Life)." This greeting is also tied to the theme of being inscribed in the Book of Life. It is most often used during the Ten Days of Repentance, the period between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

G'mar Chatimah Tovah (גמר חתימה טובה): "A good final sealing" is typically used closer to Yom Kippur. This greeting reflects further prayers that others will be sealed in the Book of Life for a good year.

Anyada bueno, dulse, i alegre. "May you have a good, sweet, and happy new year." This is a Ladino greeting used by Sephardic Jews.

Tizku Leshanim Rabot (תזכו לשנים רבות): "May you merit many years." This greeting is less common. It is used as a wish for longevity and continued health, expressing the hope that the recipient will enjoy many more years of life and celebrations.


Gut Yontif (גוט יום טוב): "A good holiday." This is a Yiddish greeting appropriate for all holidays include the High Holy days.

Chag Sameach (חג שמח): "Happy holiday." This is appropriate for all holidays.

Whichever greeting you choose, we would like to wish you and your family a Sweet and Happy New Year!
