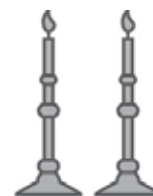

FROM THE PRESIDENT



It is hard to believe that more than a year has passed since the horrific October 7th Hamas attack. I was in attendance at the commemorative event held at the JCC on the anniversary of the attack. I think that most people there had mixed feelings. There was, of course, the sadness that we are still talking about hostages that have not been released and the many who are still displaced from their homes. At the same time, there was an uplifting feeling associated with the large number of people in attendance and the strength of the Jewish people and of our community.

One of the most palpable characteristics of the event was the increased presence of security and the many forms it takes. Unfortunately, it is a reality for all Jewish organizations that did not start with the October 7th massacre, but has certainly become a larger focal point. Antisemitism by nearly any measure taken has increased this past year. Recently, the FBI reported that the Jewish community is the most targeted religious group in the United States for hate crimes. Jews are just 2% of the population but account for 67% of all religiously motivated hate crimes. This continues the striking discrepancy between the size of our population vs the number of antisemitic events directed at us.

As a result, in the coming year, you will see some changes for Anshei Israel in our security infrastructure. Changes will reflect the suggestions of security professionals we continue to consult. Changes, however, will not alter the services and programs we offer to our congregants. No matter what, we cannot let these antisemitic attacks and threats keep us from worshiping, gathering, and passing our religion on to the next generation.

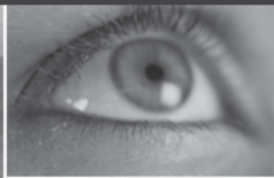
