

FROM RABBI METZ

Why I Am a Zionist, and Why You Should Be Too

At Congregation Anshei Israel, we regularly wrestle with questions of identity, justice, and responsibility. I was recently asked, "Are you a Zionist?" The answer is "YES!"



For me, Zionism is personal. It's the story of my ancestors praying

toward Jerusalem, of survival through centuries of exile and persecution. Zionism is about dignity, safety, and the right of the Jewish people to self-determination. As Amanda Berman of *Zioness* puts it, "Zionism is the movement for the self-determination and liberation of the Jewish people in our indigenous homeland." It's a movement for justice—not supremacy or oppression.

Today, Zionism is often attacked, even in progressive spaces where we've long felt at home. Some claim that seeking Jewish self-determination means denying others' freedom—this is false. Zionism is about a future of safety and hope for all, including both Israelis and Palestinians.

Loving Israel means embracing her complexities, advocating for her, and committing to her betterment. It means educating ourselves and the next generation to proudly affirm OUR connection to Israel while standing against misinformation.

When I think of Zionism, I think of my grandparents' dreams of a Jewish state, their tears when they first set foot in Israel, and my own awe the first time I touched the stones of the Kotel. We are privileged to live in a time when the Jewish people have a home. Let us stand proudly as Zionists—not out of blind loyalty, but out of love, understanding, and the unshakable belief that our people also deserve to live safely in our homeland.

FROM THE PRESIDENT



As I contemplate writing my final Presidential column for the Kolenu, Pesach is fast approaching. Leading a *Seder* is something I have done for many years for both family and friends. To me, leading a *Seder* and leading a congregation as President of the Board of Trustees have many common themes.

Involve Everyone: One of the key tenets to a successful *Seder* is to get everyone involved. For some that is reading in English, in Hebrew, or helping to make/serve the food. For some it may be all of the above, but regardless of what each participant does, it is based upon their skillset and availability. That is how I have approached our board and committee activities. Involve as many of you as possible and base that involvement on your vast skillsets and various levels of availability.

Lead Through Engagement: A good *Seder* leader is one who facilitates participation, coordinates the service/ritual based on their *Haggadah*, and has a keen awareness of their audience. This all requires the complete engagement of the leader both in preparation and execution of the *Seder*. I sincerely hope that the congregation feels this way about my presidency - that I was fully engaged in the activities in which I led or participated through thorough preparation as well as execution.

Maintain Order: The word *Seder* itself means "order," and the order of this home-based service has been maintained for thousands of years. Leadership of the *Seder* is a focus on the necessary components of the Seder and the efficiency of getting through them to reach the festive meal. Leadership of the synagogue may not be quite as well ordered, but it is certainly about the focus on the important items and efficiency in achieving them to create the tasty result: an Anshei Israel community in which we are all proud to belong.

Thank you for all your support and participation in the two years I have had the privilege of serving the congregation.



Below is a synopsis of proposed amendments to the Bylaws for membership review and approval at the upcoming annual meeting. The proposed amendments from the Bylaws Committee have been reviewed by the Board of Trustees. A full copy of the proposed amended Bylaws is available in the Synagogue office, or can be transmitted via e-mail upon request.

Proposed Amendments to the Bylaws to be approved at the 2025 CAI Annual Meeting:

- 1. Removal of the Synagogue Life Council (SLC) from the Bylaws as this committee no longer exists.
- 2. Removal of the Board seat for the Chairperson of the SLC and increase of the number of at large Board Seats by 1 to 11 to keep total number of Board Members at 16.
- 3. Clarification that maximum term for a Board Member is 9 consecutive years and any years served as an Officer do NOT count toward the nine years.
- 4. Ability to conduct business at Annual Meeting with quorum of 10% membership units without ratification by Board (currently requires 50 membership units).
